

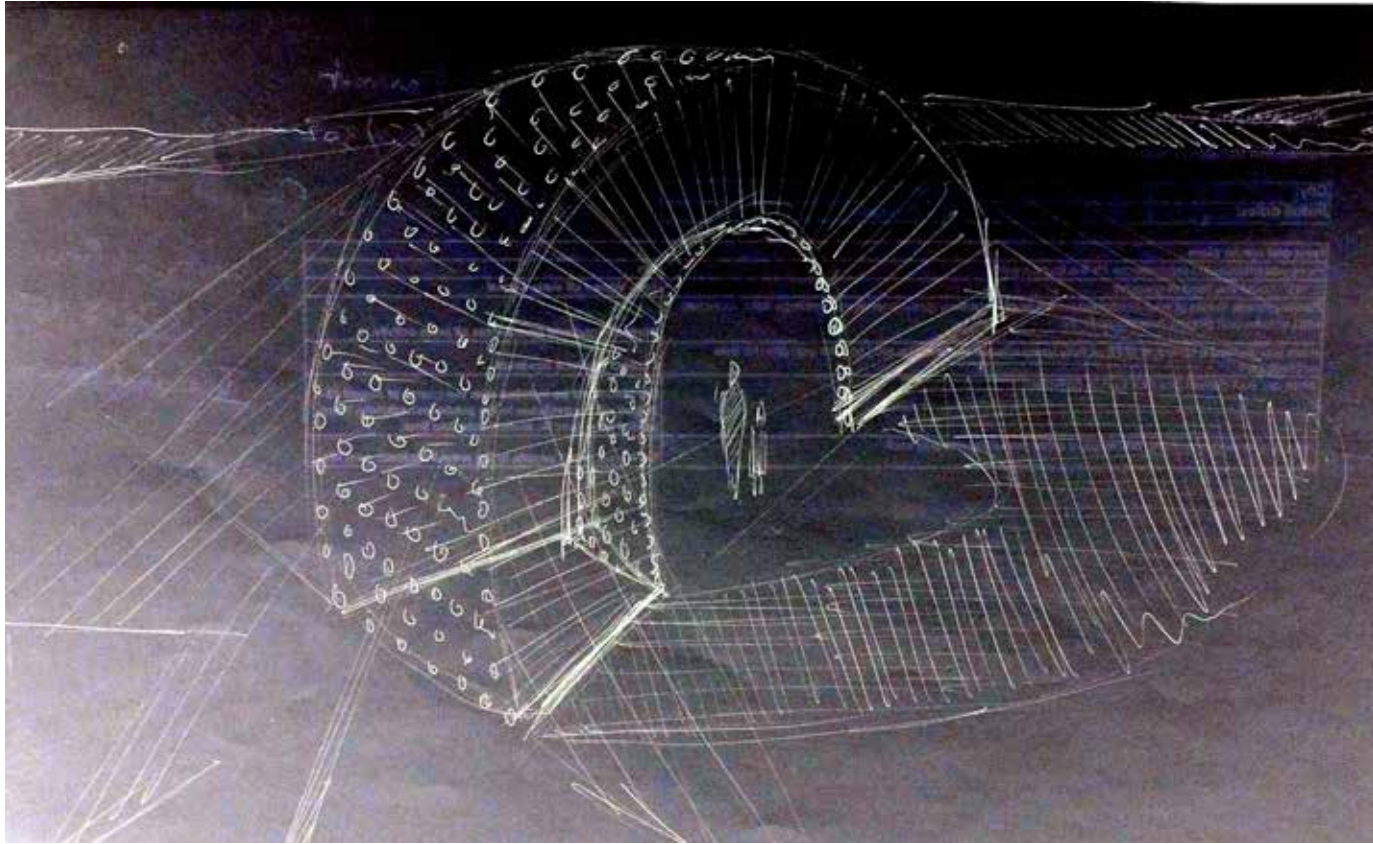
LUKE JERRAM



Luke Jerram (born in Bristol, United Kingdom, 1974) graduated with a First Class degree in architecture in 1997 and is currently a Visiting Senior Research Fellow at CFPR, University of West of England. His multidisciplinary art practice involves the creation of sculpture, installations and live-art projects. Jerram currently lives in the United Kingdom, but has been working internationally since his career began in 1997. He has created a number of extraordinary art projects which have excited and inspired people around the globe. Working with the ISVR (Institute of Sound and Vibration Research), University of Southampton the team were awarded a major grant from EPSRC and a further grant from the Arts Council England to design, build and tour his artwork Aeolus. The giant ten-ton artwork is an aeolian wind harp and optical pavilion and has just finished its tour of the United Kingdom.
